Lost in Space - The Toolbag Orbiting the Earth

Skywatchers have a new object to search for in the night sky, a small bag of tools **that/which** (See Lesson 'Key Verb Patterns and General Patterns' Lesson) is orbiting the earth.

NASA astronauts were repairing the outside of the International Space Station (ISS) **on Friday** (See 'Key Prepositions and Collocations' Lesson) when one of them accidentally let go of their toolbag, sending it floating into space.

Unbelievably, the small bag is actually bright enough to see from earth with a small telescope. If you **are interested in searching** (See Lesson 'Key Verb Patterns and General Patterns' Lesson) for it, the bag **is currently orbiting** (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lesson 1) the Earth two to four minutes ahead of the ISS, but will remain in orbit only a few months **before falling** (See Lesson 'Key Verb Patterns and General Patterns' Lesson) into the earth's atmosphere.

A space walk is **one of the riskiest activities** (See Lesson 'Key Verb Patterns and General Patterns' Lesson) that astronauts can do, mainly because they **are exposed** (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lesson 11) to excessive radiation. There is also the nightmare scenario that an astronaut might become unattached to the object that they are repairing. If the astronaut on last Friday's mission **had tried** (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lesson 15) to reach out and catch their toolbag, they could have ended up in orbit as well!
