

Grammar Topics Covered in Grammar Workouts

The grammar workouts are designed to test key areas of grammar that intermediate-advanced students consistently struggle with regardless of their native language.

The idea is to test a random selection of these topics consistently in order to change students' habits related to these areas.

(Regarding the topic of definite articles 'a' and 'the', this area on the whole does not pose a problem for speakers of Germanic and Romance languages. However, there are still some constructions which pose a consistent problem for these speakers as well, and these are regularly tested in grammar workouts).
