Below is the corrected paragraph. The correct answers are shown in red. There is a guide in blue to where you can find more information about the grammar points in this paragraph. All information can either be found in the 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' book or from lessons in the Fluency Space Academy.

France has ordered Apple to stop **selling** (See 'Key Patterns to sound more Professional' Lesson) the iPhone 12 because it is allegedly emitting too much radiation.

On Tuesday, the French government **told** (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lesson 3) the tech giant to fix existing phones, and **if** (See 'if or in case' Lesson) it cannot resolve the issue **by** (See 'Key Prepositions and Collocations in Business English' Lesson) the end of the month, ideally through a software update, it must recall every iPhone 12 ever sold in the country.

Apple **is contesting** (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lesson 1) this review, claiming that the iPhone 12 is compliant with all relevant regulations. Both Apple and the French government believe that they **are right** (See 'Key Prepositions and Collocations in Business English' Lesson), and they **want the matter to be resolved** as soon as possible. Apple **has been** one of the leading global Smartphone manufacturers since the launch of the first iPhone in 2008 (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lesson 4). With such fierce competition in the smartphone industry, it would be a major blow to apple in France if they **had to** (See 'How to Use Verb Tenses in Business' Lessons 13 and 14) recall all iPhone 12 models.
